We Are Open...Again!

Hopefully, the Hall will soon be fully open again and after July 19th there will be no restrictions. I wrote in the last issue of the Herald last November that I hoped the Hall would be used on a daily basis in the not-too-distant future, not realising how distant that would be!

The Hall has been of some use since January as Age UK have continued to hold their regular weekly Day Care session every Thursday. This was permitted as this activity is classified as health care. With the easing of restrictions other groups such as the Women's Institute and the Mothers' Union have started to hold their monthly meetings. The Hulland Hippos Mothers' and Toddlers' Wednesday session has also restarted and so, too, has Laura Daniels's weekly Tuesday pilates' session. A women's clothing sale took place shortly after the first easing of restrictions in May.


Financially, the Pandemic has obviously affected the Hall as it still needed to be heated, maintained and we continued to pay for our broadband connection even though it was hardly used. Whilst the Hall was used even once a week we carried on employing a cleaner for the weekly clean and our window cleaner carried on as usual. We have had some financial support from Derbyshire Dales District Council via the Government's business support grants and this has enabled us to maintain our reserves.

My final message is that soon the Hall will be fully open with the no restrictions so If you are considering a large family party, children's party or other event there is no better venue than your Hall – I say "your" for the Hall is a registered charity whose aims are to provide facilities for use of the residents of Hulland Ward, Biggin-by-Hulland and Hulland Village.

Annual Parochial Church Meeting

We had our APC Meeting on 27th May. Shirley Gage and Katrina Pipes were elected Churchwardens for 2021/22. The audited Accounts for the financial year ending 31st December 2020 showed an overall net loss of £6,537.86. The loss of income from fund-raising activities as a result of the Coronavirus restrictions contributed significantly to this deficit. Unlike some community organisations, the Church is not eligible for any Government support. We are, however, extremely grateful for the generosity of those who have maintained regular giving and made one-off donations.

Council Projects Update

Millennium Village Hall Car Park Extension

Cllr Len Neale, the Parish Council lead on this project, arranged for the **Planning Application 20/00765/FUL** to be submitted to Derbyshire Dales Planning in early September last year. Following approval, he obtained quotations for completion of the project, subject to the necessary funds and partnerships being in place. It is hoped work can start on the car park extension in late Autumn this year.

Although Cllr Neale has retired from the Parish Council he has agreed to advise on the project until completion.

Footpaths

Cllr Julie Morgan has continued to lead in this area, providing feedback at Parish Council Meetings of where attention is required and nomination of footpaths for improvement, in addition to leading in Planning Application discussions.

Playing Field And Play Area

Cllr David Astle has continued to open and close the main gate of the Sports Field as and when required, in addition to inspecting the MUGA and Play Area. It is brilliant to see all facilities now being fully used and football (FC Hulland) returning again!!

Picnic Table

The availability of funding allowed Cllr David Lewis, on behalf of the Parish Council, to arrange for the purchase and installation of the third Picnic Table. It is already widely used and is a welcome addition to the Play Area/MUCA facilities.

Neighbourhood Watch Hulland Ward

Cllr Maureen Atkin runs Neighbourhood Watch (Hulland Ward), now with a group of 57 volunteers who are kept informed of any incidents locally and offer advice to others.

Up-to-date intelligence on crime and scamming' has been invaluable during the pandemic, in particular.



Butterfly Zone at The Slangs

Following partial enclosure of The Slangs, Cllrs Lewis, Scott and Birkbeck planted 6 Buddleia in the smaller segment to create a 'Butterfly Zone' with plans afoot to create a community orchard in the adjacent segment later this year.

Grass Cutting

Cllr John Scott organised the grass cutting with Cartwright Landscaping (who have never stopped working) ensuring the Village grass verges were 'up to scratch' for the many 'walkers round the block' during 2020 and 2021.

Hand-Held Speed Camera

With volunteers now in place, 'pavement' training will shortly commence on the community speed reduction programme in the Village.

Cllr Karl Dean now leads on this project (taking over from Wayne Ward).

Housing Developments

18/01237/REM : Land East of Les Ardennes, in the Parish of Hulland Ward

The Blueline Homes development of 22 mixed properties is near completion with most properties sold. Public footpath access to the Village amenities remains an unresolved problem.

18/01346/REM : Land by Biggin View, Biggin in the Parish of Biggin

The Cameron Homes development of 33 mixed-houses is due to be completed late Autumn 2021. At the time of writing 11 properties are yet to be released for sale.

19/00159/REM : Land accessed via Wheeldon Way, Hulland Ward in the Parish of Biggin

September 2020, Derbyshire Dales Planning Committee approved proposals to build 39 mixed properties. A start date has yet to be confirmed.

All the above developments are shown on the Derbyshire Dales District Council Planning Portal - and also on the Hulland Ward Parish Council Website, which also shows commentary for each application from your Parish Council.

Since taking up his new post, he has been busy handling pre-existing matters and addressing new issues.

Locally, he has been in talks regarding safety issues at Waterlagg Crossroads and the remodelling will begin this October.

He has helped out with the obtaining of financial support grants for organisations who were experiencing communication difficulties.

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

Our children have continued to grow and develop as always during these uncertain times. A number of them have moved on to Hulland Primary School to continue their educational journey.


