

Holy Communion at Home Sundays at 9.00am

Every Sunday during this time when we can't use our church buildings, we shall be having a service where we are connected by telephone.

Instructions for how to access the service:

At approx 8.55am, from your land line or mobile dial this number:

0333 1133 850

Listen to the welcome message and then input the room number:

44584684#

Then you will be asked to input the PIN number, which is:

8868#

Some points to note:

- When you first enter the 'conference room' please will you say your name(s) so that those already there know that you have arrived.
- Once the service begins, all microphones will be muted except for those taking part in the service. Mics will be unmuted again at the end so people can say good bye to each other.
- If you don't currently give to your parish church by *standing order* or *direct debit*, please consider doing so while our churches are closed. If you want to find out what is involved, have a chat with your church treasurer about it. Thank you.
- You will have to provide your own coffee and biscuits after the service! Why not call someone to have a chat too?
- Call costs: please refer to the information on the back page.

Call Costs:

Under [Ofcom regulations](#), calls to your 03 dial-in number MUST be included in the bundled minutes offered by UK mobile and landline networks just like calls to 01 and 02 numbers, but please note, it is wise to check with your phone provider to confirm the specific terms and conditions of your minutes allowance.

Some, but not all providers operate a different charging policy after a certain call duration (usually 1 hour). If your provider follows this practice, our advice would be to hang up and re-dial after 55 minutes to avoid call charges.

However, our aim with our Sunday Services is to keep them well within the hour in order to prevent people from having to hang-up
