

We Are Open...!

We were delighted to be able to re-open the Millennium Village Hall in early August after nearly five months of closure due to COVID-19.

The first activity to return was Laura Daniels' Pilates classes which are held every Tuesday. Each class is limited to a maximum of 12 and she holds several sessions over the day.

September saw the return of Age UK's weekly Thursday sessions. Some organisations have held Committee Meetings in the main hall, too. The WI held their September branch meeting and will resume regular meetings in 2021.

The maximum number of people the Hall can accommodate at present is 30 (less for exercise classes). It has been decided not to open the Kitchen for the time being. For obvious reasons, the Disabled Loo is the only one in use.

The path to re-opening the Hall was complicated and there were a number of regulations which had to be complied with to make the Hall Covid-19 Secure. These involved specific signage, cleansing requirements, making sure people keep a 2-metre distance, etc.

The task was helped by an information sheet written by ACRE (Action with Communities in Rural England). This document ran to 42 pages!

Our hirers now have to agree to a new list of Covid-19 Special Hire Conditions but most are common sense and not too onerous. Cleaning of all surfaces that have been touched has to be done by the hirer but we do not charge for the extra hire time involved to carry out cleansing tasks.

It is early days for our Hall re-opening but I and the Hall Committee feel that it is a safe venue. We all need to try to return to some normality and hopefully see the Hall used on a daily basis in the not too distant future.

Local Heroes...Local Stars continued

How did our local businesses cope during Lockdown and in the months since?

Numerous local small businessmen and women were able to continue providing their services, including builders, gardeners and cleaners, during and after the official Lockdown this summer.

What of those businesses with premises serving the local population?

Margaret Allsop of **Allsop's Electricals** said they were furloughed until Lockdown ended during which time they could not carry out repairs in people's houses. However, customers who ordered new machines and were understanding when these had to be left outside their properties! Since Lockdown eased, Margaret and family have been back at work and are very busy – which is normal for the time of year – and view the future with confidence.

The Black Horse Public House was closed during the Lockdown months and re-opened with COVID-19 compliances in place. Since then business has been good and they foresee this continuing for the rest of this year and beyond.



Hulland General Stores has never closed enabling local people to obtain necessary provisions and fuel locally. A home delivery service began before Lockdown for those shielding which kept Rosie busy when she was not on duty in the shop. Wendy returned from shielding in July, and Abi left to resume her University Course – safely – in September. The Shop now offers Christmas-related items so is clearly catering for the future!



Andrew Russell of **Hulland Ward Garage** said they were closed for the first two months, although he was on standby for emergency call-outs.



Business resumed in June and has been good since with them being busier than normal at this time, and bodes well for the future.

The Nag's Head closed during the Lockdown months but offered a take-away service. Re-opening with COVID-19 compliances in place, people were able to use the outdoor areas as well as be inside. Whilst Sunday lunches are now being enjoyed, the popular take-away service and Thursday night's pie night continue.



With new features becoming available, they are looking forward to the exciting times ahead.

Kevin Thraves of **Richard Thraves Motor Repairs** said that, being open throughout Lockdown, they did experience a slight drop in business during the first few months. However, since July matters have improved and they are now twice as busy as usual for this time of year and Kevin feels positive about the future.

Danni's Farm Shop stayed open throughout Lockdown offering a home deliveries service, and personally shopping for anyone home-bound due to shielding.

Christ Church News

Rector's Ramblings: What can I do?

The doors were shut... and locked. Like every other place of worship in the country, we had to close our building when lockdown was announced in March. Before that happened we had already (reluctantly) taken the decision to cancel the Spring Fair and a Messy Church session.

The challenge: how to keep in touch with the congregation and how, if at all, could we continue with our corporate worship?

To cut a long story short, here's what we did:

- † Record some weekly talks to put on YouTube and our website;
- † Put a plan in place for members of the congregation to be called on a regular basis;
- † Set-up a regular telephone 'conference call' service to replace our worship in buildings (this averaged 45-50 callers each Sunday);
- † Live-streamed bi-weekly Night Prayer services on Facebook;
- † Ran an online Introduction to the Bible course on Zoom.

You could say the doors to the Church were shut, but the Church wasn't closed.

In addition to the above, weddings have had to be postponed, baptisms put on hold and funerals held outside in the churchyard.

Now that things have moved on a bit, we now hold one service per month in the Church (on the 2nd Sunday of the month), the Church is open for Private Prayer twice a week (Wednesdays and Sunday), and we continue with the telephone services and Facebook Live-streams. We're doing Messy Church and Hulland Hippos on Zoom.

There will be a Remembrance Service on 8th November at 10.30am in the Church but we will have to limit numbers attending due to social-distancing. We will be conducting our annual 'Service of Remembering' on Sunday, 1st November - but this will be online.

Basically, we are doing what we think is possible and appropriate whilst also keeping people safe. We are in this for the long haul and are not planning too far ahead so that we can react quickly to any changes.

I would like to say a huge thank you to those in our community who have donated to the Church during the last few months - including the Hulland Ward Farm Shop and many other individuals. Our costs have remained roughly the same, but our opportunities for fundraising are drastically reduced. Thank you for your generosity.

Council Projects Update

Millennium Village Hall Car Park Extension

Acceptable quotations have been received and approved for Architects' fees for drawing up plans and submitting the planning application. Cllr Len Neale, who is the Parish Council lead on this project, arranged for the necessary surveying work to be completed, leading to **Planning Application 20/00765/FUL** being submitted to Derbyshire Dales Planning in early September. The Application has now been approved and, with outline funding in place, the Parish Council will seek partners to complete the project. late 2020 to early 2021.

Footpaths

The Covid lockdown has created a much increased usage of the lovely footpaths around our community.

Cllr Julie Morgan has continued to lead in this area, providing feedback at Parish Council Meetings of where attention is required and nomination of footpaths for improvement.

Playing Field And Play Area

Cllr David Astle has continued to open and close the main gate of the Sports Field as and when required, in addition to inspecting the MUGA and Play Area.

It was a frustrating time during Spring, with conflicting instructions being issued for use of the MUGA and Play Area, but all facilities are now open in accordance with Government instructions.

Additional Picnic Table At The Play Area

The popularity of the 2 existing Picnic Tables suggested the need for a third by the MUGA. Following the availability of funding, Cllr David Lewis, for the Parish Council, arranged for the purchase and installation of the new Picnic Table. It is already widely used and is a welcome addition to the Play Area /MUGA facilities.

New Bench at Moss Lane

Wear and tear over the years caused the old bench at Moss Lane to fall into disrepair.

Following a decision by your Parish Council, Cllr John Scott took on the project to replace the old bench with the result shown to the right.

Housing Developments

18/01237/REM : Land East of Les Ardennes, in the Parish of Hulland Ward

Blue Line Homes' development of 22 mixed properties is now well underway with completion targeted for Spring 2021. Footpath access to the Village amenities remains unresolved.

18/01346/REM : Land by Biggin View, Biggin in the Parish of Biggin

Cameron Homes' development of 33 (2-5 bed) houses is now well underway with completion scheduled for Autumn 2021. At the time of writing, 13 properties are sold with 20 properties still to be released.

19/00159/REM : Land accessed via Wheeldon Way, Hulland Ward in the Parish of Biggin

Modified proposals to construct 39 mixed properties for Guild Homes were unanimously approved by Derbyshire Dales' Planning Committee on September 8th. The Parish Council will continue to liaise with the Developers and District Planning to ensure that key criteria, such as height control along the common boundaries and land drainage, meet the agreed standards and ensure information is made available to local residents during the construction process.

All the above developments are shown on the Derbyshire Dales District Council Planning Portal - and also on the Hulland Ward Parish Council Website, which also shows commentary for each application from your Parish Council.

Neighbourhood Watch Hulland Ward

Cllr Maureen Atkin, Neighbourhood Watch, now has a group of 49 volunteers who are kept informed of any incidents locally - and advise others. Due to Covid it has not been possible to officially launch the Hulland Ward branch but this will be done when conditions allow. Grass Cutting

Cllr John Scott organised the grass cutting with Cartwright Landscaping (who kept working during Spring) ensuring the Village grass verges were 'up to scratch' for the many 'walkers round the block'.

Hedge-Cutting Co-operative

Hulland Ward Parish Council has a given responsibility under the Highways Act 1980 to ensure footpaths along Main Road remain clear - at all times of the year. Cllr Clive New began the leaflet drop for the Hedge Co-operative in early May and the first 'cut' taking place in late June. With more than half the Villagers doing the daily walk 'round the block' hedge-cutting was more necessary than ever this year. Thanks to Andrew Hall for keeping up the good work.



Village Flowers

Hulland Ward Parish Council, again, contracted Plantscape to supply the Flower Towers and Lamp Post planters that have so brightened up the main road this Spring and Summer.

Hand-Held Speed Camera

The Parish Council agreed at its September Meeting to implement the much-delayed Community Speed Reduction Programme in the Village. To this end, hand-held speed cameras will be purchased. The six volunteers (two teams of three) already in place will operate these cameras as part of the Speed Reduction Programme. The volunteers will receive appropriate training and support on camera use and the procedures which will need to be followed.



If you are interested in being part of this project please email parishclerk@hullandwardpc.co.uk Cllr Wayne Ward, who leads this project for the Parish Council, is confident that there will be 'speed guns' on the road from late Autumn/early Winter.

Village Christmas Tree & Christmas Lights





The children basically work in a 'Junior' and 'Infant' bubble and are kept separate. We look forward to the time when we can once again play happily altogether.

Improving our telephone system is a major priority for the Practice. Please be reassured our Receptionists answer as quickly as they can and, if it isn't urgent, you can email the practice at brailsford.admin@nhs.net. These emails can take 48-72 working hours to be processed (like medication requests) so please don't use this for clinically urgent enquiries, or if you require an appointment on the day you make contact.

We all look forward to the Pandemic being a distant memory but, although initial access to GP appointments is always by remote contact (telephone, video or e-consult), until then we would like to reassure our Patients that we remain available, committed and very keen to provide a safe and reliable Primary Care service whilst keeping all our staff, visitors and patients as safe as possible.

If we can deal with your enquiry remotely it helps avoid unnecessary travel and contact in the Practice but face-to-face appointments will be organised on an individual basis.

We do appreciate how frustrating, in so many ways, are the effects of Covid-19 restrictions on our lives. We welcome suggestions of newer or more innovative ways to keep our service running with as little disruption to patients as possible.

We regret that the Hulland Ward Surgery services and clinics have had to be cut back but are pleased to announce that, following our recent recruitment to both Clinical and Reception staff, we hope to have clinics available every morning Monday-Friday from 8.30am to 12noon. Medication collections will continue to be via appointment slots at Hulland. The Dispensary service will continue Monday-Friday from 9.00am to 12noon and 2.00pm to 6.00pm from the window at the Brailsford Surgery.



7 essential safety tips for driving on country lanes in winter

With Winter comes the navigation of potentially icy, dangerous and congested country roads. We've all been there and we've all worried about friends and relatives heading out in the car when the roads are treacherous.

First and foremost, when driving on country lanes, it is crucial that we drive **slowly and cautiously and take extra care on bends**. It is also important to **use designated passing areas** where possible, and be **extra vigilant for wild animals** - including rabbits, pheasants, squirrels and badgers - as well as dog-walkers and horse-riders who should be wearing high-visibility clothing to ensure they can be seen.

Automotive specialists *Lookers* and have put together seven essential tips for driving safely on country roads over the festive period...

1. Before winter arrives put your car in for a health-check.
2. Perform essential checks before setting out...tyres, lights, indicators, anti-freeze levels.
3. Get any repairs carried out straight away.
4. Be aware of ice and react safely.

What to do if your car skids.. In their guide to driving on ice, the RAC advise that if you encounter a skid, you should gently steer into it. The direction in which you begin to move should be the direction you turn your wheel. Do not remove your hands from the wheel, or apply the brakes sharply.
