Welcome to this service for Maundy Thursday

On the first 'Maundy Thursday' there were many events which led up to Jesus' arrest. This service has been designed to help us reflect on some of those happenings. It may help us to prepare to remember the events of the following day.

As you look through the order of service you will see that there are opportunities for quiet reflection, with some questions to prompt your thoughts. A couple of minutes of silence will be left to help us pause and reflect.

May we be united with Christ as we remember his body, broken and his blood, shed for us.

On this night, he commanded his disciples to love, but suffered rejection himself.

We pray for the rejected and unloved.

Lord, hear us

All and fill us with your love.

On this night, he reminded his disciples that if the world hated them it hated him first.

We pray for those who are persecuted for their faith.

Lord, hear us

All and give us your peace.

On this night, he accepted the cup of death and looked forward to the new wine of the kingdom.

We remember those who have died in the peace of Christ.

Lord, hear us

All and welcome all your children into paradise.

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

**All Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours
now and for ever.
Amen.**

At the end of this reading, the priest will consume the bread and wine. If you have any at home, you may consume it now. You may pray the following prayer:

**Thanks be to you, Lord Jesus Christ,
for all the benefits you have given us,
for all the pains and insults you have borne for us.
Since we cannot now receive you sacramentally,
We ask you to come spiritually into our hearts.
O most merciful redeemer, friend and brother,
may we know you more clearly, love you more dearly,
and follow you more nearly, day by day. Amen**

Reading: John 13:1-17

For reflection after the reading:

- Try and imagine how embarrassed the disciples would have been when Jesus began to wash their feet. How would you have reacted if you had been there?
- "You also should wash one another's feet". What does that mean for you? Whose 'feet' are you being called to 'wash'?
